Hi Council,

I hope your first three weeks back in class have been good, and that you weren't too distraught by the sudden cancellation of classes on Thursday and Friday. Despite the dire provincial health situation, we believe it is relatively safe for in-person classes to proceed with mandatory vaccination, and the university and government agree. It is appalling to me, though, that we are in this position. The complete failure of leadership by the provincial government on COVID-19 is a stark reminder to all of us in positions of authority of the importance of accountability, integrity, and thinking ahead. I think constantly about the people affected by the near-collapse of our healthcare system and our province's very uncertain future in the coming months.

COVID Advocacy

As you all know, the executive team has consistently advocated for a safe return to in-person classes. We believe that the vaccination mandate announced by the University is an essential part of that, and we fully support the University's decision. Please see our statement [here](#), and comments to the Edmonton Journal [here](#). The feedback and comments we have received from students are 90%+ in favour of the vaccine mandate and remaining in-person, and we have advocated accordingly.

We are continuing to support in-person classes despite the present state of public health emergency due to the high vaccination rate on campus. No outbreak has yet been attributed to academic activities at U of A, likely due to our mask mandate and vaccination rate (which will only improve). The only outbreak associated with the community so far was at Beercade and likely due to unvaccinated individuals dancing without masks in close proximity with community members. However, we are prepared to reevaluate our position if there is an outbreak on campus or the situation changes in other ways. Public health is always our first priority.

Allegations against Ricardo Acuña

I should begin this section of my report with a content warning as it involves sexual violence. Ricardo Acuña, the President of the Academic Staff Association, has been accused of sexual assault and inappropriate behaviour towards numerous women. The UASU has issued a [statement](#) calling on Acuña to resign from his positions of power on campus or to be removed, mainly because of the unacceptable position of power he holds in a community with many people who could be at risk, but also because of his

conflict of interest regarding AASUA's advocacy against policy changes to better protect students from predatory behaviour by instructors. We continue to take this very seriously and will change our relationship with AASUA until Acuña is removed.

Get Your Shot contest wrapup

A project that has been taking up about 20% of my time this week has been wrapping up the Get Your Shot contest. In total we finished with nearly 9,000 entries, ran under budget, and massively increased engagement with Perks. While it is impossible to know how many people were vaccinated because of the incentive, if the number was even in the hundreds (which I think is realistic) I feel the contest was a success. Increasing community buy-in and support for vaccination is important as we move into a period where they become mandatory, though nobody anticipated that at the time that we started the contest. I have been in touch with our donors to thank them for their generosity in supporting the project, allowing us to run a \$40,000 contest at minimal cost to the UASU.

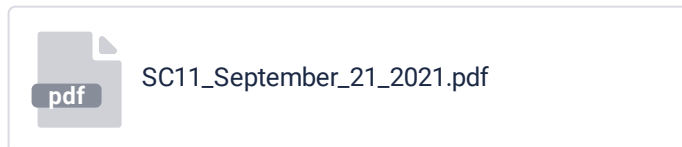

Dear Council,

I hope all of you are doing well. Here is a summary of what I've been up to over the past couple of weeks. As always, please don't hesitate to ask me any questions if you have any.

SRA Summit Planning

I've created a form to collect SRA responses on what they feel many of the most prominent issues on campus are. Once we gather these responses from SRAs, we will filter and group them to narrow down on 1-2 topics for the Summit.

Academic Integrity Working Group

I am currently working with the University to develop an eclass page with a series of modules on academic integrity and academic citizenship. This resource would span all disciplines and utilize resources the University already has. This project will be to frame academic integrity and citizenship in a positive light, highlight why students should care, help students through situations they may encounter in University, and take a universal design approach with current students in mind.

So what is Academic Citizenship? Academic citizenship encompasses the benefits and responsibilities of belonging to the academic community and all interactions with and within the academic community. Every member of the university community enjoys certain rights and advantages related to academic freedom and, as a result, has a shared responsibility for academic integrity. Following principles of academic integrity, equity, diversity, and inclusivity, academic citizenship safeguards research and scholarship integrity, maintains the value of your degree, contributes to a rich academic culture, and ensures the safety, dignity and inclusion of all members of the academic community.

Why did this project start? When students enter University, many assumptions are made. For example, that students know how to cite correctly, read the code of student behaviour, or always read their entire course syllabi. Many students who have had issues with academic integrity face problems about these things and get through uni without really developing the proper skill set for academic integrity violations or being an academic citizen. This issue tends to become problematic food for many students down the road in their actual jobs.

How can you be a part of it? Please reach out to me if you are interested in being a part of the project! This will be a volunteer opportunity that will take up approximately 8 hours between October and December. Over that time, you will have the chance to:

- **Consult** with the working group
- Be a part of a few **focus groups**
- **Be a film star** and participating in scenario-based videos for the modules
- **Provide feedback** on the consultation process and films
- **Pilot the modules** and provide feedback for final edits

This is a fantastic opportunity to champion something that is an issue on campus and needs action. As student leaders, our voice is fundamental in ensuring that this eclass page is created with students in mind and is of value to us. Please reach out to me with any questions you have, and I highly encourage you to join me in being a part of this project!

Academic Accommodations

Over the past couple of weeks, I've received several highly concerned students about their previous accommodations that are now changing in delivery. Of these, the most prominent are the note-taking service and exam accommodations. The delivery of these services this year is very disappointing on the University's part. Many students only found out 1-2 weeks into the semester that the University made changes to accommodations they have been using for years. VP Dixon and I have met with the Dean of Students Office and requested the following:

- Accessibility Resources send an email to students ASAP that clearly outlines what is happening, what is changing, what students registered need to do, and how these changes may impact their accommodations.
- The Dean of Students Office finds a way to support students who need exam accommodations like 1.5x or 2x time multipliers. Students are anxious, instructors can't be in two places at once, and we need a solution before entering full midterm mode.
- The Dean of Students looks at overhauling the current academic accommodations system. Currently, it is a very tedious and time-consuming process to get a formal diagnosis for accommodations. It can be costly to get a diagnosis; some instructors may deny accommodation requests despite a diagnosis. The software used to book accommodations is terrible. Most of all, the students who require accommodations are required to request accommodations for each of their courses. Nothing about this process is student-centred, and we have started advocating for replacing the current system with one that has students in mind.

Student Group Committee

The Student Group Committee will be meeting on Friday, September 17th, to discuss an item related to the Undergraduate Psychology Association and the recommendation to the Students'

I'm happy to be seeing you again. I hope you've all had a great start to your semester and have been keeping safe and healthy. Is anyone taking any cool or interesting classes? Or, let me rephrase that. What is the best course you've taken so far? Mine has to be Sociology 224: Sociology of Deviance and Conformity. The course focused on how "deviant behaviour" is defined and the factors that influence us to conform or break societal norms. The first five people to message me will get a prize!!

Quick plant update, I got three new plants to add to my collection. Two Peacock plants (Calathea Makoyana) and another Ficus.

U-Pass Update

Arc distribution started Monday, September 13th, 2020, and will continue till October 1st, 2021. As of Friday, we have distributed over 20,000 Arc cards. Communications have been going out to students through our social media, newsletter, UASU website, and the University U-pass website. We also have ads up on SUTV and the LRT signage and posters around SUB. Once you get your Arc card, you can activate it by going to ualberta.ca/upass. The turnaround time for the Arc card to become active is around one day but could take up to a few days. Arc distribution will end on October 1st. After October 1st, Arc cards will be the only form of valid transit fare and just need to be activated once. We are focused on ensuring a smooth transition over to Arc cards.

Sustainability and Capital Fund

SCF Green Fund

The Sustainability and Capital Fund committee (SCFC) has been working hard to finish up the 2021-22 SCF Green Fund application this year. The application is nearly complete and will go out to students in the next few weeks. On top of finishing up the application, SCFC has begun to determine how adjudications will work this year and the requirements needed to receive funding. We are building from what we learned last year and incorporating some new ideas to ensure that we are evolving and improving.

SUB Planning Committee

Applications for the SUB Planning Committee closed on Monday; thanks to everyone who applied. We are now in the process of shortlisting candidates and conducting interviews.

Finance Committee

Finance Committee first started out working on the terms of reference for the Fee Governance Review committee and getting them approved. Now, we are in the process of reviewing the mandates of our current DFUs. What are mandates? Why are mandates important? Mandates are a way to keep the organization or DFU in question accountable. It's easy to see why this is important if we imagine what would happen if a DFU decided to spend its money on something completely unrelated to its mandate. Who will ensure that DFUs are fulfilling what they promised and not acting unreasonably? That's where mandates come into play. It's about accountability and transparency. I'm happy to report that our review has been going well and is almost completed.

Student Equity Survey Working Group

As I've previously mentioned, a student equity survey was in the process of being developed to gather demographic data for all university students on equity-related characteristics to support and report on the university's goals, objectives, and strategies related to building a diverse and inclusive community. After integrating the feedback received from students, the survey is now completed and will be distributed in the next few months. A distribution plan is yet to be finalized.

Hi everyone!

As you probably guessed, the past two weeks have been very hectic for the exec. I hope you had a less intense week and are getting to enjoy the first few weeks of classes despite our little online scare! Here are some of the things I have been working on. **Please note that I talk about sexual violence on the last page, so feel free to skip that if you need to.**

Advocating for Improvements to the Academic Accommodations

As many of you know, I use academic accommodations, and I've always been passionate about improving them. In the last couple of weeks, Abner and I have started advocating for these changes, particularly as some have been negative changes to the program. Here are some of the things we have been working on:

We conducted a PERKs survey to learn more about students experiences with Academic Accommodations. You can find the survey results [here](#). Now that we have this info, we can advocate for effective change.

We met with Helen from DOS and told her about the changes that need to be made. She was very receptive. We talked about developing a strategy for improving Academic Accommodations over the next year by conducting surveys, focus groups, and working with experts.

Advocated for immediate changes to Academic Accommodations that were changed due to COVID. There have been two big changes to academic accommodations. The first is that they got rid of the note-taking service. This was a service that provided students with access to notes that they cant write themselves. We have advocated for this service to be reinstated immediately. There were also issues with proctoring and communications about the changes, we have asked for communications to be sent out this week clarifying the changes.

Advocating for increased mental health supports

This month we've ramped up mental health advocacy. I have met with folks in residence about creating new and exciting programming in partnership with the PSC and the COVID Rapid Response Collaborative. Hopefully, I will be able to update you all soon about the new and exciting things to come!

Advocating Sexual Violence Prevention Efforts

Since May, I have been pursuing avenues to improve prevention efforts at the university and support for survivors. Sadly it's been an uphill battle. I wanted to give a big update about some key things we have been advocating for:

The hiring of the Sexual Violence Prevention Coordinator. As many of you know, students are currently paying for this position. When I started as VPSL I was told that the position would be hired by August, but the university has been dragging its feet. Since May, myself and Rowan have been pushing the university to speed up the process. Last week on Monday, we sent a very strongly worded email to Wendy Rodgers and again got no updates. Finally, after a survivor came forward this week on Wednesday (I speak about that at the end of my report), we were told they would prioritise the hiring and tentatively promised it for October. It is disheartening that it took someone speaking publicly about their assault for movement to be made.

Creating a mandatory sexual violence training program. The creation of this program was part of my platform. We applied for a grant that would give us the money to hire a person who could develop this program for the university. Unfortunately, we didn't get the grant. We are currently in the process of identifying and applying for other grants that could meet our needs.

Increasing access to supports for survivors. This is a project that hasn't gotten much attention yet. We are now working to finalise a website that would allow for safe disclosure, connect people with resources and support survivors. We are also working to create reporting guides for students from different backgrounds and whose first language is not English.

Finishing the Experiential Learning Policy. Abner and I have been working on finalizing this process since May and have found it incredibly challenging. We are working with University admin to finish this policy.

Advocating for changes to the collective agreement. The AASUA collective agreement provides lots of protects to academic staff accused of sexual assault. We are advocating for changes to this agreement to provide more supports to students.

Content Warning: Sexual Assault

This week a survivor of sexual violence made a [public appeal](#) to the University and the UASU last week. The survivor has disclosed that they were assaulted by Ricardo Acuña, a University of Alberta professor and President of the Association of Academic Staff of the University of Alberta (AASUA). The UASU has also learned that Oxfam recently removed Acuña as the chair of the Oxfam Canada Board and a member of the Oxfam International Board due to allegations of sexual misconduct. We believe survivors. We are working with the survivor to get justice and provide support. We are also calling on Acuña to resign as AASUA President and as Executive Director of the

University's Parkland Institute. If he doesn't step down, we are asking that he is removed from these positions.
